

As you are aware that with ever increasing number of vehicular population, the road accidents has become a general norm rather than an exception. In order to prevent the frequency of accidents leading to fatalities, grievous injuries the Road Safety Cell in the Department of Transport has been established. The mandate of the Road Safety Cell is to analyse the causes of the accidents and to suggest remedial measures to prevent the occurrence of accidents and to bring down the accident rate to near zero. Besides this the objective of the cell is to create awareness among the general populace and the stakeholders about the need to practice the culture of road safety in order to make roads safer for all road user viz., passengers, drivers, pedestrian etc.,. Hence besides suggesting the technical and other measures to prevent the accidents the cell also focusses on IEC activities so as to promote the behavioural changes in the road users. It is a common knowledge that community participation is must for any programme to succeed. Thus Road Safety Cell has taken up an agenda to make general population aware about the need to practice the culture of road safety. In order to address the issue for reducing the frequency of accidents, the Department of Transport Himachal Pradesh has launched a Road Safety Awareness Programme, which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister Himachal Pradesh on 04/08/2019.

In continuation to above campaign, Department of Transport has decided to launch a Road Safety Quarterly Newsletter so as to increase awareness about the need to practice Road Safety. This will be the first issue of Road Safety Newsletter. The objective is to keep community and general public informed and engaged in Road Safety issues that will address the larger issue of road safety problem. In this regard Department of Transport would like to invite your contribution for the first issue of Road Safety Newsletter and it will be a continue feature.
